

I am a cheerleader for the arts community!! It is my greatest pleasure to be surrounded by creative people such as yourself. What – you say – you are not creative? Of course you are! You've had to be creative when things don't turn out the way you planned – whether it was your trip plans, your meal plans or a flat tire. You develop another way to resolve whatever comes your way.

About 17 years ago, I started a journey of learning how to write grants. It was **no** fun. It was not something I had any confidence that I could complete. (I have a need to accomplish something and have a positive outcome.) Well, that was not to be my experience with grant writing. I have had several mentors along my journey and I am grateful for their encouragement and gentle pushing. I have spent hours and hours listening to reviewers discuss my grant applications and some have been brutal but I always take away a lesson learned and it helps me be a better grant writer. I have worked on grants with panels of people to accomplish a beautifully written application. I have worked alone on many, many grants and at times feel like tearing my hair out!!! Then all of a sudden, the pieces all seem to fall into place and the image becomes vivid in front of me. It was all worth it!

- I will share a couple of grant opportunities that you might want to learn more about and if you are interested in being mentored along your journey, I will surely share what I can with you.
- Remember, you should not get discouraged. Perfection takes a while!!!

Colored Pencil Workshop

Instructor: Pamela Edevold

When: June 20 - 22, 2023

Place: Bagley Public Library

Times: 10 am - 4:00 pm each day

Cost: \$100

During this workshop we will work in layers using Prismacolor Pencils on colored Canson paper.



We will begin by working together from the same image, learning how to use the pencils to quickly create form and realism.

The second and third days, students may work from their own 8x10 head and shoulders photo or continue with the image started on the day one.

The focus will then be on bringing the pencil drawing to a finish–refining edges, heightening color, playing with backgrounds, and detail work.

The supply list that students will need to bring will include a basic set of Prismacolor Pencils, kneaded eraser, Canson Mi Tientes paper, drawing board (BAAC has some if needed), and masking tape.

The Ancient Legends of Norwegian Trolls will be drama a production that includes character practice, dress rehearsal and two on-stage performances in front of a live audience. Workshop Title: Getting the Right Focus

Please note: This workshop is intended for dedicated camera users – not smartphone cameras.

Cost: \$50

Dates: June 10 and June 17

Place: Itasca State Park, Jacob V Brower Visitor Center Classroom

Daily Times: 10:00 AM - 3:00 PM

Photographer, Lowell Wolff, will be leading the classes. His most recent solo exhibit, Reflections of Northern Minnesota, was featured at the Watermark Art Center in 2021 and the Reif Gallery of the MacRostie Art Center in 2022. It is posted on his website at https://www.YoDreamcatcherImages.com/reflections-of-northern-minnesota.

Day 1 will begin exploring the role of "focus" in photography – both from an artistic and mechanical perspective. Students will learn to choose the best focusing mode to express their vision of subjects in nature photographs. After exploring focus modes, students will spend time photographing the many wildflowers Itasca has to offer. The day will end with students discussing what they learned during the day.

Day 2 will begin with students sharing their best image(s) from Day 1 and the week between class sessions. For each image shared, students will explain what their vision was for their selected photograph and the degree to which they accomplished their vision. Suggestions for improvement also will be offered. The day will end with Lowell sharing his workflow of image processing using Lightroom, DxO PhotoLab 6, Helicon and other software he uses.

MONO PRINT TRANSFERS ON CLAY: POTTERY PLATTERS WORKSHOP

Dates: April 10 - 14, 2023

Time: 9:30 AM - 12 Noon and 2:00 PM to 5:00 pm

Instructor: Kate Hammer

Location: Clear Waters Life Center - Gonvick

Cost: \$100 which includes all supplies

Images drawn and transferred using the mono print transfer technique. This is my favorite process and I am excited to share the magic with you! This is a 5 day workshop.

Day 1 - Demonstration of creating a mono print transfer, transferring the image onto clay, and shaping a platter. Design and drawing of your transfers.

Day 2 - Clay work day. I will walk you through the mono print transfer process, step by step, and you will produce your first platter. Drawings and prep for 2nd clay work day.

Day 3 - Studio work day. Trimming of platters.

Day 4 - Studio work day.

Day 5 - Glazing.
